**Articulation Agreement
for Transfer
from Pasadena City College
to Scripps College**

Women accepted for admission to Scripps College from Pasadena City College will be eligible for junior class standing when they have completed a minimum of 64 transferable semester units. Pasadena City College women who have maintained a B average or higher in at least 32 transferable units are encouraged to apply.

*Women completing the **PCC Scholars Program** as part of at least 64 transferable semester units at Pasadena City College are recognized as well-prepared and are **guaranteed priority consideration** at the junior level.*

Transfer Credit Limitations

1. A maximum of 64 transferable semester units (equivalent to 16 Scripps courses) will be accepted from Pasadena City College for transfer to Scripps College.
2. Only courses graded "C" or higher (not including C-) will be accepted for transfer.
3. Courses passed on a Credit/No Credit basis at Pasadena City College will count only as elective credit toward the bachelor's degree requirements and will not meet any General Requirements or major or minor requirements at Scripps College.
4. No grades of transfer courses will be used in computing the cumulative grade point average at Scripps College.
5. Most courses at Pasadena City College numbered 1-99 and identified in the Pasadena City College Catalog as being transferable to the University of California (UC) without limitations *and* offered in academic disciplines at the undergraduate Claremont Colleges (Claremont McKenna, Harvey Mudd, Pitzer, Pomona and Scripps Colleges) will be accepted as transfer credit.

Transfer credit will **not** be granted for: Administration of Justice; Architecture; Business except 12A/B; Communication; Computer Information Systems 1; Dance except 21A/B; English as a Second Language; Fashion; Geography except 1 and 1L; Graphic Communications Technology; Health Education; Journalism; Library; Management; Mathematics 3, 12, 15 or 22; Music Performance, Ensembles and Workshops; Nutrition; Physical Education; Psychology 33; Speech except 6; Theatre Arts 29-75.

Independent study courses in any discipline will only be considered for transfer credit by petition.

6. No transfer credit will be accepted from a Pasadena City College transcript for credit earned by examination or military experience. Transfer credit for Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, and CLEP will be considered separately upon presentation of scores and as defined in the Scripps College catalog.
7. Applicability of transfer credit to meet requirements in the student's major will normally be limited to introductory courses and will normally be considered only as prerequisite to the major. Scripps academic department faculty *may* accept transfer upper level courses toward the major *if* an introductory course in the discipline is prerequisite and was previously passed. At least one half of major courses must be completed at Scripps College.
8. Transfer credit earned as semester units at Pasadena City College will be converted to Scripps College courses based upon one semester unit being equivalent to one fourth (.25) Scripps course. One Scripps course is equivalent to four semester units. Any individual Pasadena City course equivalent to three semester units or more may be considered to meet a specific requirement at Scripps.

**Applicability of Pasadena City College Courses
towards Scripps College General Education Requirements**

ENGL 1A required; ENGL 1B and/or 1C strongly recommended.

First-Year Writing Requirement

Transfer students will be placed into the Core sequence based upon their class standing at entrance. Students who transfer with the equivalent to 4 or fewer Scripps courses will begin with Core I and complete the 3-course sequence. Students who transfer with the equivalent to 5-8 courses will complete Core II and III. Students who transfer as first-semester sophomores (8-12 courses) must complete only Core III. Transfer students entering Scripps with the equivalent of 12 or more Scripps courses will be waived from the Core Curriculum requirement.

Core Curriculum in Interdisciplinary Humanities

Fine Arts: One 3- or 4-unit transferable course from Studio Art—11A-39D (but not Art History); Music; Photography 21-24B; or Theatre Arts; and

Breadth of Study (one course in each of four areas)

Letters: One 3-unit transferable course from Art History—1A-9; Chinese 12; English 24-82; French 5A/B; German 5; Italian 12; Japanese 5 or 12; Philosophy except 30 or 33; Religious Studies; or Spanish Literature (5, 6A/B, 12); and

Natural Sciences: One transferable course *with laboratory* from: Anthropology 1/1L; Astronomy 1; Biology; Chemistry; Geography 1/1L; Geology; Physical Science 37; Physics 1A or B or C or D or 2A or B, 10/10L, 31A or B; or Physiology; and

Social Sciences: One 3-unit transferable course from Anthropology (except 1/1L), Economics; History; Political Science; Psychology; or Sociology.

One of the following 3-course sequences:
American Sign Language 10A, 10B and 10C (10D highly recommended);
Chinese 1, 2 or 2A, and 3 (4 highly recommended);
French 1, 2 and 3 (4 highly recommended);
German 1, 2 and 3 (4 highly recommended);
Hebrew 1, 2 and 3;
Italian 1, 2 and 3 (4 highly recommended);
Japanese 1, 2 and 3 (4 highly recommended);
Latin 1 and 2 with third semester to be completed at Scripps;
Portuguese 1, 2 and 3 (4 highly recommended);
Russian 1, 2 and 3 (4 highly recommended); or
Spanish 1, 2 or 2A, and 3 (4 highly recommended).

Students completing Arabic 1 and 2, Armenian 1 and 2, or Modern Greek 1 and 2 will need to complete a third semester of the language at another college or university offering that language to finish the language requirement in one of these languages.

One course from among: Math 9 (or higher level Calculus course); Philosophy 30 or 33; Social Science 10; or Statistics 18 or 50.

One course from among: English 25C or History 25B (or at Scripps)

One 3-unit transferable course from among the following:
English 50, 51, or 52;
History 12, 29A or B, 31 or 41;
Music 25;
Psychology 29, 31 or 41; or
Sociology 14, 29, 31 or 41.
